Activities:

- ·Review of Weekly Vocabulary: Students were asked to memorize and understand set vocab words each week.
- •Math Lesson: Students learn new mathematical skills and are then allowed to practice themselves. Tutors usually assist students as they complete packets for practice.
- ·Homework help: Students bring work and complete it during the end of each session. Tutors are available on standby to help.

Discussion:

This program made me reflect on how each person is really different when it comes to learning. Coming into the program 1 expected it to be a cake-walk, so to speak; I felt I knew the high school material enough that I could reteach the students. However, this program reinforced the notion of knowing versus understanding a subject.
